School Office

We want to make sure that we know which students are arriving after the bell or are leaving early, in the interests of keeping all students safe and accounted for. We ask that students come and see Mrs. Libby at the office if they come in a little later than 8:13 to pick up a 'Glad you are here!' slip so she knows they have arrived. If your child needs to leave early for any reason we ask that the adult picking him/her up comes to the office to sign the student out. Mrs. Libby will gladly call down to your child's classroom to request they come to meet you at the office!

The school office is open from 7:45 – 3:00 Monday to Friday.

Our office is always ready to serve you.

School Supplies

Students in Grades K-5 are purchasing a supply package for \$45 from the school this year; please be sure to send in a cheque as soon as possible made out to Tyson Elementary School. If you are sending cash, please put the correct change in a baggie or envelope, labeled with your child's name. This year we were again fortunate to receive support from Staples, Murray Honda, and a number of other local businesses in the form of backpacks which contain school supplies.

Parent Volunteers

Parent Volunteers are always welcome in our school. Please contact your child's teacher directly if you wish to help. All visitors to the school need to sign in at the office upon arrival and will be provided with a Visitors tag. Please Note — <u>ALL VOLUNTEERS MUST COMPLETE A CRIMINAL RECORD SEARCH</u>. These must be re-submitted every 4 years. Forms may be picked up at the school office.





Parking Lot

Please take care driving through the parking lot during drop-off and pick-up (actually at all times!). Remember to stop in the pull-through lane when dropping off or picking up students. *Children aren't always as mindful of their environment as we would like them to be!*

Meeting Spot

Please establish a <u>pre-determined meeting spot</u> **outside** the school. The end of the day can be a busy time for teachers and students. Students and teachers need to maintain focus, complete tasks and get students organized for homework. Encourage your child to become more independent and take responsibility to get themselves ready at the end of the day. It builds resiliency skills and further prepares them as they get older.

Supervision

Teachers supervise the playground 15 minutes prior to school starting in the morning, at recess and 15 minutes at the end of the school day. During the noon hour there are three supervisors and multiple other staff outside on duty.

Bicycles/Scooters/Skateboards

Bikes and other wheeled "vehicles" (including scooters, roller skates/blades and "heelies") are to be **walked** onto and off of the school grounds. Bikes are to be parked in the bicycle racks by the back of the school. Please make sure that the bicycles are locked and that helmets and other wheeled modes of transit are taken into the classroom for safekeeping.

Electronics

Cell phones, iPods, and other electronic devices are to be kept in backpacks during school hours unless a teacher or EA is providing direct supervision for their use as an educational tool.

Dress for the Weather

Students benefit from fresh air and exercise, they need it to thrive, so we will be sending students outside most days for recess and lunch. Please dress your child in appropriate footwear and bring a coat if the weather looks damp because unless it is pouring rain or the temperature is close to or below zero, we'll be heading outdoors! The great thing about our school is that it has a large undercover area so for those students who really don't like the rain, there is an option to go and play there.

Behaviour Matrix

Fair Notice

The Chilliwack School District and community partners are committed to making our schools safe for students and staff. As a result, schools will respond to all student behaviours that pose a potential risk to themselves, other students, staff and members of the community.

Student threat assessment protocol: Fair Notice





What behaviours initiate a student threat assessment?

A student threat assessment will be initiated when behaviours include, but are not limited to, serious violence or violence with intent to harm, kill, verbal/written threats to harm/kill others, Internet website/MSN threats to harm/kill others, possession of weapons (including replicas), bomb threats and fire setting.

Duty to Report

To keep school communities safe and caring, staff, parents, students and community members must report all threat-related behaviours.

What is a threat?

A threat is an expression of intent to do harm or act out violently against someone or something. Threats may be verbal, written, drawn, posted on the Internet or made by gesture. Threats must be taken seriously, investigated and responded to.

What is a Threat Assessment Team?

Each school has a Threat Assessment Team which is multi-disciplinary. The team may include Principal, Vice Principal, District Resource Teacher, School Counsellor and Police.

What is the purpose of a student threat assessment?

The purposes of a student threat assessment are:

- o To ensure the safety of students, staff, parents and others.
- o To ensure a full understanding of the context of the threat.
- o To understand factors contributing to the threat makers' behaviour.
- o To be proactive in developing an intervention plan that addresses the emotional and physical safety of the threat maker.
- o To promote the emotional and physical safety of all.

What happens in a student threat assessment?

All threat making behaviour by a student shall be reported to the Principal who will activate the protocol for the initial response. Once the threat has been activated, interviews may be held with the student(s), the threat maker, parents and staff to determine the level of risk and develop an appropriate response to the incident. Intervention plans will be developed and shared with parents, staff and students are required.

Can I refuse to participate in a threat assessment process?

It is important for all parties to engage in the process. However if for some reason there is a reluctance to participate in the process by the threat maker or parent/guardian, the threat assessment process will continue in order to promote a safe and caring learning environment.
