NEW IDEAS

- School apparel- Avonlea will check out the pricing for school apparel
- Facebook Market- Avonlea, Sam and Stef will plan on how this will move forward- getting items donated, putting items on Facebook, etc....

New Business

- Story Workshop- K-5 Oral language storytelling. Grant for \$3000.00 has been used to gather supplies for building stories using manipulatives such as pine cones, rocks, sticks... Due to Covid, there is concern with sharing items so there is a need to purchase more plastic bins and felt mats. Teachers are asking for \$75.00 to purchase the plastic bins and felt mats to create 30 kits. The materials would sit for 3 days before the next cohort would sign out the cart.
- STEM- Make-Do- teachers are asking to purchase two Make-do sets that have 360 tools. Students would be able to make different items using tools, screws, cardboard. This discussion was tabled till the next meeting once we find out if we can use the gaming grant to support this.
