Approval of Agenda and Minutes

The agenda for the June 2020 meeting will be reviewed and approved at the October meeting.

Principal's Report

- Start-up and numbers- one division has been lost, so there are split classes. Some students have moved to distance learning. 22 students have joined Learn from Home. 220 students enrolled, down from last year at 238
- Staffing: Counsellor (Thursday at the school), EAs (all 8 EAs have returned, 2 are on leave so there are replacements) , Teaching staff (there are two new teachers who have joined the staff)
- Learn at Home: Transitions support- 22 students have signed up for this
- Athletics/Teams- cross country running has started. The students are being timed and the times are being sent to the district to determine the scoring.
- Classroom budgets- each classroom teacher will get a base amount of \$200.00 plus \$15.00 per student registered by September 30. Primary teachers will get \$50.00 per class, and a teacher who is teaching a new grade will get \$50.00.
- School Trustee : Trustee David Swanky
- Covid protocols at school if a student gets sick- if a student has any of these symptoms, they will go into the isolation room and wait for their parent/ guardian to pick them up.
SYMPTOMS: The Ministry of Health has switched to a shorter list, (Fever, Chills, Cough or worsening of chronic cough, shortness of breath, loss of sense of smell or taste, diarrhea, nausea and vomiting) but the district has not yet adopted the shorter list. They are waiting for the Ministry of Education to approve it, but this hasn't happened yet. The longer list is what we are still working from right now. Please see the attached Student Daily Health Check at the end of the minutes.
