Fundraiser Report

- Poinsettia's Steff has talked to them, will try and set up a delivery date hoping to correlate with Purdy's pick up in late November/early December
- Pies will be delivered Dec 15, fundraising Nov 22-Dec 6
- Christmas Auction in the gym is postponed this year
- Online Christmas Auction was a success but took a lot of backend work to get it set up, might look at doing a Spring one instead
- Treat Day, will hold off for the new year to get that started
- Grade 5 hoodies, PAC will pick up the cost for any students who cannot afford one
- Tyson spirit wear, will come out in the new year, Joanna will look into having them for sale on MunchaLunch
- Pancake Day, idea of having the Friday (Dec 17) before Christmas break in pyjamas, possibly having firefighters or Kiwanis to cook, get supplies ourselves, would be a PAC donation to students Allyson will price out items
- Global Coffee, makes custom coffee for our school, \$15/lb, we keep \$5/bag, leave until Spring for Mother's Day or Easter
- Online Bingo Night the company does the backend work, there is a base cost of \$350, people will donate items that are auctioned off, tickets are sold for \$10 to play music bingo on Facebook, a portion of each ticket goes to the school, each round they win an auction item good idea, maybe try at a later date, we will discuss for January and maybe cut out the middle man and try to do just as our own school community
- Hot Lunch lots of people loved SinAmen Bun Co. as a hot lunch
- If your child will not be there on a hot lunch day and an order is made, the person handing out orders needs to be made aware ahead of time, not the day of Mrs. Libby will make a list of changes that need to be made, Deirdre will email the PAC the policy of what people should do (phone or email Mrs. Libby their instructions)
- Allyson and Aliya will be helping run hot lunches
- Thank you to all the parents who have been helping on hot lunch days recently!
