## Principal's Report

- With the new health order, we are moving back to the communicable disease plan that we had in the Fall. Not much will change, kids will go both ways in the hallways, hopes to have assemblies back. Each student in school will receive 5 rapid tests each soon.
- Grade 4/5 basketball is starting, Mrs. Sutcliffe and Mrs. Simington are coaching, it is just in house as playing other schools wasn't dependable, they will get more playing time this way!
- After basketball will be Rugby and then Track and Field, we are hoping for an all-district track meet in June like past years
- District is starting to look at staffing levels, we have received their proposal of numbers, we will look more closely at staff levels next month, April 4 out of catchment kindergarten siblings can be brought in, April 19 kindergartens out of catchment can be brought in, May 2 Grade 15 out of catchment can be brought in
- Met with Brad from Habitat, company that the district works with for projects, looked at spaces for outdoor learning, thought the area by the old portable would be best. Talked about the options, it is very expensive (basic outdoor seating is \$12,000 plus \$13,000 more for an expansion plus another \$2000-3000 for site work)

• Teachers were interested in outdoor learning space but many teachers are wanting a few iPads for each class to have as their own

- Kindergarten and Grade Ones would like to purchase an incubator and a brooder to hatch eggs in class, 5 classes will share as the eggs develop and grow in their stages \$425
