# Ongoing Business

- Snow blower was purchased last year with school funds for Mr. Dumont
- Carpet Cleaner: Mr. Dumont would like it for cleaning up daily accidents
- Hoover Power Scrub (399.99) on sale for \$139.99 + tax is a carpet cleaner he would like
- Motion to spend up to \$200 by Kara V., seconded by Chelsea R., unanimously approved
- Mural: was discussed in September, the other option was picnic tables and trees have not got a quote yet
- Some worry that bringing tables into the back of the school will bring more graffiti/trouble
- Ms. G had started working on ideas for the mural, we would like to keep her involved
- Brooke and Carli B. will run a committee that will also include staff to get ideas, quotes, artists, etc.
- Carli B. is in contact with Ms. G. and has a list of local artists to possibly work with on the mural project
- Grant for \$3000 that the school can apply to go towards the mural
- We cannot vote to spend a set amount of money since we don't have a quote yet
- We voted for priorities in September (8 for mural, 7 for benches/trees), we need to decide as a PAC what is a
  priority for us to fundraise for
- Motion to make this our primary fundraising goal, motioned by Chelsea R., seconded by Deirdre O'C, unanimously in favor to focus on fundraising for the mural

#### New Business

- Vicky F. removed as a signer on the PAC accounts as she is a school district employee
- Rebekah D. is now a supervision assistant, also a school district employee, which would leave only two signers
- It does not go against our current C&B to keep a school district employee as a PAC account signer
- Motion to keep Rebekah D. on as a PAC account signer, motioned by Chelsea R., seconded by Allyson H. Unanimously approved, Rebekah D. abstains.
