Staff Requests

- Mr. Dumont requests a Carpet Spot Cleaner for rugs/carpet for when accidents occur involving urine, feces, vomit, and dog excrement tracked in from the field, etc.
- Approx. \$200 for a home-use type machine. We will put this request out to the parent/guardian membership to inquire about possible donations, or if someone in our Tyson family that may work in this industry could advise regarding obtaining an industrial use machine at low cost to the school/PAC.
 (Note: The school carpets/rugs are cleaned professionally twice per year, but these types of messes can occur daily at the school.)

Open Discussion and Questions

- Why do we bus to the Blue Heron Reserve for the Terry Fox Run instead of walking in our area? Answer: Jim Edgcombe (principal a few years ago) started it to build community amongst students at the beginning of the year. The kids also have more fun going there than just walking around the school.
- Why is One School One book taken from general instead of gaming? Answer: Some teachers read the book to their classes so it could be considered being used as curriculum which the gaming grant cannot provide funds for. To be safe from audits, we have put it in general.
- What is the Gaming Grant? Answer: Casinos and lottery sales are taxed extra by the province and those extra taxes go back into the community. Eligible community groups can apply to get grants from this money, PACs are one of these groups and we receive \$20 per student in our school based on enrolment at the time of applying (apply in spring and receive the funds in the fall).
