- After our meeting in May the executive did approve money for popcorn (\$71.76) and candy bags (\$124.77) at Sports Day, there were extra costs incurred that totaled \$49.64 which were paid out. Total profit for Sports Day was \$470.38.
- Executives did meet last week to approve \$150 for meet the teacher night
- The gaming grant is still waiting for approval, it will be added with its own budget when we receive it

Constitution and Bylaws Committee Report

- The goal of the committee is: to seek clarity, to be more inclusive, to define possible contentious issues, to foster increased involvement by addressing roles and committees in detail
- The committee was Jennifer G., Allyson H. and Amy H. these people were selected because of their experience on PAC's and working on C&B's in the past
- The goal was to be fair for all and fair to the voices we heard from
- It was announced in June 2022 that the project was being started, a deadline of August 1, 2022, was set for changes to be submitted, we received only 2 submissions
- No one contacted us until September 18 with concerns about the proposal
- The proposal was emailed out to all parents on September 2, which is sufficient notice before the PAC meeting based on our current C&B
- The plan to vote to pass this proposal or not was supposed to happen today but has been postponed because of concerns that have been brought forward
- We have had more than 5 submissions to have an additional meeting to discuss the C&B and the rationale for the changes
- An additional meeting will be planned and announced shortly
- We request that people submit in writing what they have concerns about, and which statements can remain, this will help the meeting be effective and focused
- We have received only 1 submission of changes that should be made
- We expect those that requested an additional meeting be present at the meeting
- This additional meeting will be announced with 15 days' notice before the meeting

DPAC Report: <u>dpac@sd33.bc.ca</u>

- Meeting in June did not happen
- October 15 is the municipal elections, advanced voting is on October 7 and 12

- Seven trustees can be voted in, there are 15 candidates, please get out to vote!
- DPAC is hosting an all-candidates debate in partnership with ChillTV on September 29, it will be posted on the DPAC Facebook page
- Saleema Noon will be redoing the body science presentation on zoom on November 28 from 6:30-8pm, can have up to 300 parents, register by emailing dpac@sd33.bc.ca
- DPAC had a meeting with admin about childcare policy, on Sept 13 went in front of the board of education and policy 662 childcare was passed, the start to many steps
- There are some surveys to help track in our district where there are severe needs, this data is used to see what needs there are. Piloting has begun with a child and youth worker pushing into classes, moving strong start to locations where the need is higher. Education is now considered from Age 0-18, the school district is working together with childcare centers to support children earlier in the education (discussion points from Brooke)
- As the new school year begins, DPAC would like to remind parents that they are there to assist and advocate for parents and caregivers with the education system when needed. They are a legislated organization recognized within *B.C.'s School Act* to represent the parent voice at the school district level and all information is confidential.

- DPAC sent an advocacy letter to various Gov't Ministers and Regulatory Bodies regarding the inequitable access
 to the administration of Doctor Prescribed Seizure Medications for those students who had been seizure free for
 over 12+ months. Updated as of Sept 8 2022 Ministry of Health put out at Letter amending this
- Next DPAC meeting is on September 29 at 7:00pm at Neighborhood Learning Center at Chilliwack Secondary, limited to DPAC reps and one other person (max of 3 people per school), all other dates will be open to all parents/caregivers/guardians
- As an executive we have appointed Jennifer G. as an alternate for being the DPAC rep, with Allyson H. as the DPAC rep.

- Compiled previous events/spending to see what our budget should include moving forward
- Inflation has been accounted for in some of the numbers
- Gaming grant is separate from the regular account, it will have its own budget, we don't have that figure yet because we have not received it for this year
- Budget must be approved beforehand in May so that money can be spent right away in September, example, we did not have an approved budget to start this year, so we were not able to provide funds for a back to school barbeque which was requested by admin
- We will vote on the gaming grant in October when the grant funds are provided
- Motion to approve the general budget, motioned by Chelsea R., seconded by Allyson H.
- All in favor of the general budget unanimous

 Mrs. Toor is asking for the indoor curling kit (\$50) for all students to use for one week in November, motion to approve, motioned by Kara V, seconded by Chelsea R. Unanimous approval.

New Business/Voting

• Possible Fundraising Projects:

- A project that we have talked about last year was planting trees and benches in our back field
- We received a quote in May, which has expired, we did not get details on how to move forward with this after getting that quote
- Brooke will contact the operations department to get details about the steps we need to take and the current prices
- · Another project identified by staff is to redo the mural on the gym, wanting to have indigenous art to replace it
- Next step is to see what our priority is, benches/trees or a new mural
- There will be extra costs to install the benches/tables, might also be delays with new schools taking up most the time of operations department
- Deirdre has contact with Carrielynn Victor for doing a mural (\$5,000-8,000), she also has researched where to get grants to help with funding for projects like this
- We also have a few other local people (our Indigenous EA has other contact with other artists) that we can reach out to for the mural
- If you have any ideas to discuss at meetings, please send the information ahead of time to the executives so it can be discussed with all the information ready
- 8 in favor of prioritizing mural, 7 in favor of prioritizing trees/benches
- There was a request for Terry Fox bussing will be voted on for approval

• Volunteer positions:

- we have received interest from other parents to take on hot lunch and fundraising coordinator positions, to ensure that all members have a chance to participate we are asking for volunteers
- Please contact the executives if you would like to be a hot lunch committee chair or fundraising coordinator, in our C&B the executives can appoint committees for these roles
- The deadline is Tuesday, September 27 11:59pm to put in your name
- After this deadline, the executives will review the candidates and appoint individuals to those positions
- The executive have decided to suspend these positions until new volunteers are appointed
- Hot lunch committee is responsible for executing and planning hot lunch days, the chair will be the liaison with the
 PAC executive and administration to plan appropriate events on agreed upon dates. They will need to coordinate
 with local businesses that provide hot lunch menus. The chair will need to understand and know how to use the
 online ordering system.
- Fundraising Coordinator they will be overseeing fundraisers that the PAC presents, they do not need to run all the fundraisers but should be able to seek volunteers for the fundraisers. They need to receive updates from those involve and present reports at general meetings for the current fundraisers
