  - Mrs. McDougall is back with a Grade 3 / 4 split class
  - Mrs. Bjorndal has joined as librarian
  - Mrs. Froese has joined ELL / PE Prep teacher
  - We are in the process of hiring an Indigenous EA
  - This year we are 283 kids with 14 Divisions
- Meet the Teacher
  - Went really well, saw a lot of new and known faces, thank you for coming
  - Brooke enjoys using the ticket approach as a fun way meet everyone
  - Feedback and/or suggestions are very welcome; let Brooke know what you think
- Bowls of Hope
  - Soup is back this year and is being served every day now
  - $\circ$   $\;$  Last year lots of kiddos came for soup and parents weren't aware

- $\circ$  There has been feedback some parents want to know when their kiddos are having soup
- We also want to be inclusive and will find a balance between kids' and parents' needs
- Mrs. Jewra is monitoring our approach
- Bowls of Hope will be doing their Christmas Card Fundraiser this year and some of our classes will be making cards for the campaign
- Feeding the Future Fund
  - Our School District has hired help to manage spending the money
  - Bowls of Hope is serving food on behalf of the fund
  - The District is asking us to feed 25% of our in-need population
- Term Focus
  - Term 1's focus for the first 90 days will be around belonging and connection to school understanding which kids are and aren't and how we can improve
  - Term 2's focus will be around numeracy with math helping teachers coming to the school to facilitate and support
  - Term 3's focus will be around early literacy and the collaborating teachers will be coming to the school to help with reading interventions
- Physical Testing
  - Mr Dave Allen physical literacy and PE teacher for years will be here this year working with classroom and PE Prep teachers around physical literacy for kids to be happy, healthy and active.
  - o Mr. Allen will visit Wed/Thu/Fri this week (week of Sep 25) and is physical testing all Grade 2 students
  - o These students will then be re-tested in Spring 2024 to assess and implement improved practices

  - This year we have a new photo company Edge which is all online
  - Packages will come home soon
  - Feedback is welcome! Does everyone like this company?
  - Last company's costs were getting too high for both the school and the parents

  - Kiddos are making an orange feather and creating wings pictures will be posted

- Some outstanding expenses still, but otherwise haven't spent much yet
- New format for the budget spreadsheet to be a little easier to read
- Gaming funds:
  - haven't come in yet so any blank spots you see on the budget are going to be part of the gaming funds once we receive it
  - Seems gaming is running behind this year and is still processing all the applications.
  - Last year we got the funds Sept 28 but some say it will come in October this year
  - Every PAC has to submit the gaming summary report annually which we have now submitted.
- Fees include munchalunch from last year this year we'll put all the transaction feeds in this category as well that way everything else shows as pure profit
- Terry Fox bussing will be closer to 650 because kinders will be joining in the spring

- Focus last year was communication 0

- BOH has a community garden across from treatment plant 0
  - some gardens are open to the public, some are private and can be rented and another section is a gathering place
  - Anything not harvested will then be donated to BOH
- DPAC did an emergency preparedness committee 0
  - Some schools will get an inquiry on what their status is
  - Feeding Futures Fund dedicated to feeding kids, more details to come
- DPAC has started a newsletter The Review more details to come 0
- Old Business Updates: 0
  - DPAC will now be funded \$5K each year from the Ministry going forward and PACs will also keep their funding from the Ministry
  - Affordability fund Tyson has money left and can spend on school supplies, field trips, etc for this year as well
  - A/C in portables advocacy

- Abbotsford school calendar goes 2 weeks longer than Chilliwack so Abbotsford pushed for all portables to have A/C
  - In a previous year Abbotsford had to shutdown schools for the last 2 weeks due to the heat dome and lost their days in class
- Asking parents and families for feedback around heat and worktime
- At Tyson our south facing classrooms are actually hotter in our school than the portables
- Classrooms fall under WCB so we have to rely on Staff Admin to provide feedback

- We are forming a fundraising committee with a planning meeting soon
  - We want to look at doing a co-run committee here as well and would like to host a dedicated meeting to discuss and plan fundraisers for the year

# ONGOING BUSINESS

- Welcome Back / Meet the Teachers
  - Meet the Teachers was on Sept 21st
  - PAC bought and supplied the cold treats for \$322.03
  - We hope everyone enjoyed!
- Terry Fox Field Trip Bussing Costs
  - Last year PAC voted to pay for bussing again new pricing will come in at \$600/650
  - Will happen in April next year this time
- Signing Officers on Financial Accounts
  - Chelsea R. and Jessie K. have been added; Jennifer G. has been removed; Rebekah D. and Jennifer L. remain signers as well
- Calming / Safe Room Upgrade
  - Last year PAC voted to pay for additions to the Calming/Safe Room
  - This has been done, we paid \$490.91; see report attached
- Popcorn machine

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- Last year it would take 3hrs to make popcorn with an additional air popper, but the popper would die
  - It's not feasible to continue with the current popcorn machine
    - It does work, it's just small capacity, we could sell it or rent it out
- We are looking for a new machine in the \$300-\$500 range
  - Last year popcorn profit was around \$1200 so it pays for itself
  - We had healthy discussion around the options and decided on a price range
- Motion to approve up to \$700 for a new popcorn machine
  - Brittany c. Motioned, Jessie K. seconded, vote unanimous Approved

# **NEW BUSINESS**

- C&B Updates
  - As agreed in our C&B special meeting last October, Jessie K. will motion in October's meeting:
    - To change the executive term start from Aug 1 to Jul 1
    - To increase the amount spent without general PAC voting from \$150 to \$250
  - We will vote in our next meeting and require a 2/3 majority to pass each
- Goal or Project to focus on this year

- Outdoor playground, bench, table or shade addition
  - PAC would like to bring in an accessibility swing
    - Brooke checked and is not an outdoor swing available in the District
    - Brooke will get quotes
    - There is an indoor swing available but she has safety concerns because the calming room does not have locks
    - Brooke will talk to Jill about a sensory path option.
      - They have asked Vedder to make one for the little hallway to the sensory room.
      - Not a fan of a big one in the halls as it may be too distracting and will require maintenance.
  - Landscaping company proposing outdoor classroom setup
    - Concrete rock type
    - Teachers would like to have a classroom space outdoors
    - Look to support a whole class
  - Buddy bench?
    - They just hold coats, no one really uses it
  - Shade Sails
    - Create shade for summer; High grade tarps/canvas
    - Given the heat between May and September, shade might be something we should consider more
    - We can take the sails down during winter even?
  - Send us your suggestions!
