- There is a 12-page report of all the things the DPAC did this year, find it here
- DPAC has many vacant spots on committees, check their minutes to see what committees can be joined
- Affordability fund, there will be a food security amount coming for next year, schools need to spend all of it because it doesn't transfer to the next year
- DPAC has asked admin to ask PAC's about their \$150 grant from the district, to see if it can be pooled to the DPAC to be used for the whole district instead of each individual school.

New Business

Proposed 2023-2024 Budget

- This is general budget projections, gaming will be voted on in September
- \$150 from district could possibly move to DPAC
- Credit card fees and munch-a-lunch fees have been lumped together
- \$350 for meet the teacher would come out from gaming from this year
- Bank admin fee, PAC has to pay for photocopying that they do in the school
- We have applied to the gaming grant, needs to be spent in two years, not three anymore
- This budget can be amended next year but it's nice to have a budget approved to cover things early in the year
- We have about \$3000 from gaming that will carry over to next year
 - motion to approve 2023-2024 general budget, motioned by Carli B., seconded by Karina C., unanimously approved.

Financial Accounts Accessibility

- We need three signers for cheques
- Jennifer Geng needs to be removed from the financial accounts
 - motion by Brittany C. to remove Jennifer Geng as a signer, seconded by Kristina J., unanimously approved
- Chelsea Rice to be added as signer to the financial accounts
 - motion by Kristina J. to add Chelsea Rice as a signer, seconded by Allyson H., unanimously approved.
- Jessie Kik needs to be added as signer to the financial accounts
 - motion by Deirdre O'C to add Jessie Kik as a signer, seconded by Chelsea R., unanimously approved.

District Funding for DPAC and PAC's

- We receive \$150 from the district every year, it is not set aside for a particular need
- We have been asked by admin and DPAC to transfer these funds to the DPAC so it can be used district wide
- Having this money pooled can allow more presentations and possibly record presentations to keep on file and have as a resource.
 - DPAC gets about \$2500 for gaming, they approached the district about the \$150 each school gets
 - DPAC reps' will make the decision on how this money is spent if the DPAC's receive the money
 - There is nothing documented that secures this money for PAC's, it could be gone next year

^{**}Expenses that need to be approved before the gaming budget is presented but will come out of 2022/23 gaming money.

 VOTE: 14 in favor of transferring the \$150 to DPAC, 1 opposed to transferring the \$150, 2 abstaining from the vote.

Staff Asks (amendment)

- Jill Jewry, child and youth care worker, wants to update the calming room and safe room for students
- Wanting sensory stickers, dimming lights, sensory items, paint for the walls, furniture for the room
- There is a grant that can help cover costs to help with this for future years
 - Motion by Carli B. to approve up to \$500 out of the gaming money to help cover the cost of these items in the sensory room, seconded by Chelsea R. Unanimously approved.
