- All hot lunch days for the rest of the year are in the school calendar – check it out and mark your calendars
- We will be working to setup vendors for term 2 and will open all of term 2 on munch a lunch in the last week of school before winter break.
 - Some vendors we are interested in for the rest of the year: Subway, Bannock, SinAmen, Taco Del Mar or Hugo's, White Spot and Mary Browns.
 - Other suggestions – PitaPit, GoodTaco
 - WokBox was well received – the kids loved it - so we'll do it again if we can.

- Mural
 - Really exciting news – we have had a \$10,000 grant come in from TransMountain under their Community Investment Grant!
 - Thank you to TransMountain for supporting our school community with their Community Well Being grant
 - Thanks also go to Deidre O’Connor for spearheading this grant initiative and bringing it to fruition – the application and approval process took many months!
 - The exec would like to return \$3,000 to the school’s Indigenous Education fund which paid for the deposit last school year
 - The intention of the TM grant is for community well-being so we discussed honouring the intention of the funds with whatever we decide to do
 - The Principal explained they are looking to do a big weaving project which would be displayed in the entrance of the school with the Indigenous Ed funds
 - We also talked about adding another mural into the gym – everyone in attendance is very keen on adding murals to the inside of our school in general. More murals!
 - Jessie K. motioned to transfer \$3,000 back to the school from the grant money, Kristina J seconded, - vote unanimous. Approved.
 - The exec would also like to memorialize the mural by creating a plaque with the artist’s description of the mural and mounting to the exterior so the general public can read and understand the intention
 - Plaque options and a quote will be worked on and District approval sought; if we can’t mount it externally we will have it displayed inside the school instead
- Popcorn Machine
 - Came in time for our first popcorn day and it was amazing!
 - 150 bags were made in just 1 hour! We were all ready and cleaned up and delivered popcorn for recess. A great success.
 - Next time we’ll be even faster.
 - We have listed the old one on Facebook marketplace but no takers yet
- C&B Updates
 - Approved changes from last meeting have been updated and posted online
 - We have a new set of changes proposed which will be voted on in January:
 1. Within **Section III - Interpretation of Terms** of the Constitution add:
 - a. **“Chair”** means the person responsible for leading and organizing the committee being chaired; will also execute all related work if there are no other executives or coordinators on the committee.
 - b. **“File”** means the document will be stored both within the PAC’s OneDrive (Microsoft 365) account and publicly on the PAC webpage
 2. Where “with appropriate notice” is mentioned change to “14 days notice”
 - a. This change will apply to these sections:
 - i. Constitution **Section IV – Dissolution**
 - ii. Bylaws **Section III – Meetings**
 - iii. Bylaws **Section IV – Executive Meetings**
 3. Within **Section IV – Dissolution** of the Constitution add “within School District #33” to the end of the last item:
 - a. In the event of dissolution of the PAC, all records shall be placed under the jurisdiction of the principal of Tyson Elementary School.
 4. Within **Section II – Membership** of the Bylaws change “council” to “PAC” within this sentence:
 - a. At no time shall the council have more non-voting than voting members.
- Playground Upgrade/Project
 - This is a big project that is taking a lot of time to get organized
 - We need to continue to work on this throughout the year in preparation to fundraise and apply for grants in the next school year most likely (multi-year project)
 - To start, we have to choose our most ideal items and then have the District review and approve/deny.
 - Once we have that, then we can figure out feasibility, timelines and pricing with the vendors
 - We definitely want to investigate the shade sails as a priority item – there are hundreds of options.
 - The poles would be permanent – do we want 3 or 5 or more?

- There is an artistic colourful flower shade which would be fun, otherwise, the more standard shades can be done in 1-6 pieces and make more artistic looking that way
 - The shades would come down in the winter to prevent damage and we would need to store them
- Everyone is also very interested in a picnic style table so we will look at those options as well

NEW BUSINESS

 - The e-mails will only be used for PAC and DPAC related minutes and meeting information and will be kept to a minimum
 - We will look at doing a newsletter format if possible, though this takes time to put together and we may not be able to do this right away
 - All reminders and communications through the Tiger News, FB and Instagram will continue as is
- Teacher Ask: Microphone
 - The school is asking the PAC to purchase two new, cordless microphone for assemblies and holiday productions
 - The current microphones kind of work, but are broken and have been dropped/pieces broken off.
 - The new microphones would be kept in the Principals office, locked up and checked out only when needed. The current ones can stay in the equipment room
 - The microphones are a specific brand for the sound system we have (the sound system was purchased by the PAC a few years ago, hence why this request is coming to the PAC to purchase)
 - The estimated cost is \$649 each, currently on sale (\$100 off) and the school is hoping to get them before the Christmas concert!
 - Discussion points:
 - Could we find a different microphone for cheaper?
 - Check Amazon? Does it have to be purchased through Long & McQuade?
 - Can we use the gaming grant to pay for these?
 - We think so. It would have to be a Canadian company. Have to check the rules
 - We have money in gaming that has to be spent this year so this is a great way to do that.
 - Motion to approve \$1500 for 2 new microphones paid by the gaming grant, if allowed; otherwise, we will approve \$750 for only 1 microphone through the PAC general account.
 - Motioned by Kara V.L., seconded by Rebekah D., vote – unanimous – Approved.
- Teacher Ask: Kitchen Donations
 - Teachers would like to have cooking classes in the school kitchen but there are some missing pieces of equipment needed
 - This is not an ask for the PAC to purchase anything, teachers are hoping some parents will have extra of these in their kitchens to donate
