DPAC REPORT

- Last meeting was January 25.
- A surplus of funds was identified in the District budget. The budget was amended to increase line items to disperse the identified surplus.
 - School budgets \$/student was increased. This hasn't happened in a long time.
 - Amendments that align with DPAC advocacy efforts are:
 - Funding to hire a communications manager.
 - Funding for the district to install portable air conditioners in all the portables. A memo informing principals went out at the end of November.
- Plans for the Rosedale site.

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• Rosedale may become a middle school, but plans are not finalized. Approximately 18 months before school completion there will be a boundary review and the final decision will be made then.

- Feeding Futures Update & Check-in
 - DPAC followed up on Feeding Futures First initiative and gave feedback that PACs were not seeing differences as of December.
 - DPAC is told that the work up until now has been figuring out what the need is, what has been happening in schools and what they can address. Plans, training and contracts have been the priority, and we should be seeing some of the fruit of that work in the coming months.
 - Three initial goals of the Coordinator were / are: Breakfast / Lunch / Safe Food Handling at all sites.
 - For up-to-date info on this program, follow along here (also available under the new Inclusive Schools Website!)
- Menstrual Health and Roll-out
 - Recognize that teachers weren't well prepared for the conversations that were prompted (students and parents) from this initiative. We have communicated this to the District.
 - Parents/caregivers are also encouraged to send emails to the district / board in this regard.
 - Teachers should have key messages from the District or Ministry to support their conversations with students and parents.
 - No garbage cans in stalls for menstrual products.
 - Trustee Reid will take the info back and follow-up.
 - Dispenser location in some schools is not very private.
 - Project AIM provides menstrual and incontinence products to the public. They also accept donations of opened, individually wrapped items.
