Boundary Review

- A new site has been acquired on the east side. A school will be built for the 2027/28 school year with 500 seats to help redistribute enrollment.
- It doesn't sound like anything has been finalized for enrollment changes, but there are a few ideas including-
- Move Late French Immersion from Chilliwack Middle School to Rosedale Traditional once the new school opens, to relieve capacity pressures at Chilliwack Middle.
- Moving late Immersion to Mt. Slesse Middle or consolidating both early and late Immersion at Rosedale Traditional.
- Another idea is to move *late* Immersion from Vedder Middle to Mt. Slesse Middle as part of broader catchment realignments.
- There will be a new 500 seat elementary school on the east side opening in 2027/28 school year.
- Changing Imagine High to grades 6-12 because of low enrolment.
- It is also my understanding that the school district is trying to find enrolment relief for GW Graham, by redistributing enrolment back to catchments. Therefore, taking a student from each middle school and placing them back into their catchment school...?
