Members present discussed several potential issues to consider, including:

- Student cell phone use and its impact on learning, engagement, and school culture.
- School trustee elections and opportunities to support parent awareness and informed participation.
- Traffic and transportation concerns affecting student safety around schools.
- Artificial Intelligence (AI) education, including opportunities and challenges for students, families, and educators
- Resources and supports for students, including continued advocacy related to Educational Assistant (EA) staffing and support commitments.
- Availability and accessibility of hygiene products within schools.
- Supporting students, families, and school communities through the implementation of Enrolment and Facilities Review decisions.
- Advocacy for increased access to school-based mental health supports, including fulltime counsellors. Discussion noted that Child and Youth Care Workers (CYCW) and other support staff are often required to respond to a wide range of urgent needs, which can limit their capacity for preventative and ongoing student support. Potential partnerships with community non-profit organizations were also identified as an area for exploration

DPAC has hired Carrielynn Victor as the artist for the new DPAC log. The goal will be to have a new design near the start of the new school year.

Updates were provided on Project Rose, a new joint partnership with UBC, SD33, Chwk Community Services and others, with the goal of the partnership being to work directly with community partners and [substance-affected] families to develop research that will design or strengthen programs, policies or resources that reduce chronic school absenteeism in ways that match the real-life circumstances of families in Chilliwack. The first in-person meeting on the subject will be on June 4th at 9:30 am, and an invitation was extended to all DPAC reps. DPAC exec will be in attendance. If you feel you could be of assistance to this program, please contact us.

Trustee Willow Reichelt provided an [update on the Enrolment and Facilities Review](#), noting that while the final outcome may not satisfy everyone, significant effort was made to consider and balance the feedback received from stakeholders throughout the process. Upcoming transitions will also be heavily weighed and considered by staff.

- Bowls of Hope was one of only 6 organizations in the province to be awarded a \$1 Million investment through United Way's BC Large Food Infrastructure Grant, in partnership with the Ministry of Social Development & Poverty Reduction, to support food security initiatives in Chilliwack. This allocation will directly go towards improving food storage, processing, and distribution to streamline services for our students and community. We are very appreciative!
